Tree Preservation Order

Hunter's Hill Council's Tree Preservation Order (TPO) was adopted by Council on 13 December 1982.

The order reads:

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Municipality of Hunter's Hill, by resolution carried at a duly convened meeting on 13 December 1982, has made an order in terms of Hunter's Hill Local Environmental Plan No.1 and Clause 8 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Model Provisions 1980, prohibiting the ringbarking, cutting down, topping, lopping, removing, injuring or wilful destruction of any tree (other than Rhus or Privet) within the Municipality, having a height greater than 3.5 metres of a trunk greater than 300mm in circumference measured at 1 metre above ground level, excepting with the written consent of the Council Any person who contravenes or causes or permits to be contravened, the provisions of a Tree Preservation Order, shall be guilty of an offence and liable to prosecution.
