<p>Critical Steps in this Activity:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Conduct plant log sheet check • HIGH • Ensure enough people are on hand to feed chipper operations and lookout • HIGH • Feed the chipper from a side position away from the front of feed chute. Once the feed rollers catch the operator is to move away from the feed line of the chipper • MEDIUM • Feed the bulk end of branches into chipper in feed rollers first • MEDIUM 		<p>Potential Hazards:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Faulty or damaged equipment • General public near chipper • Manual handling injuries • Entrapment/Amputation 	
<p>Safety Controls:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Test the operation of emergency shut down prior to the woodchipper leaving depot • Implement traffic management plan also try and barricade area of work from public and other people • Park chipper as close to works as practicable. Cut limbs into manageable pieces for 1 person to lift • Do not remove any guards from chipper. Ensure machine is switched off, and all moving parts are stopped before working on machinery 			

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Never climb onto, or stand on the in feed chute of the chipper • MEDIUM 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Entrapment/Amputation 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensure the operator does not have loose items of clothing that may get caught or snag on pruning material as it is fed into the chipper
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Always stop the in feed rollers prior to correcting an action or clearing up small pieces of wood or leaves on the machine • MEDIUM 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Trip hazards 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Do not place hands or other body parts in the openings of the chipper. Do not use metal pushers to push pruning's into feed opening
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Weather Conditions • MEDIUM 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Heat, floods, fire, fog, rain, winds and lightning 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Carry water in hot conditions. Wear wet weather clothing in winter. At times these activities may have to be rescheduled to another time because of conditions.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clean up worksite & remove any signs or barricades • MEDIUM 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Trip hazards • Traffic • Manual handling • Signs 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensure there is no prune material left on the ground in close proximity to the operation position which may cause a trip hazard. Always wear PPE and make sure footing is firm when getting out of vehicles. Pull vehicles off roadway as far as practicable when picking up signs. Always use correct lift when placing signs onto trucks.
